Texas House Northeast Candidate Endorsements continued

Rep. Tony Goolsby (R-Dallas) District 102

Tony Goolsby was first elected to represent Texas House District 102 in 1988 and is currently serving his eighth term in office.

He currently serves as Vice Chairman of the Committee on Higher Education and is a member of the Committee on Licensing and Administrative Procedures.

Rep. Goolsby serves on the Joint Select Committee on Higher Education and the Legislative Oversight Committee on Higher Education.

Rep. Goolsby earned a 91 percent voting record with the Texas Farm Bureau AGFUND during the Session.



Rep. Ray Allen (R-Grand Prairie) District 106

Ray Allen, a sixth generation Texan, has been a member of the Texas Legislature since 1993.

Speaker Craddick chose Rep. Allen to serve as Chairman of the House Committee on Corrections and as a member of the House Committee on Government Reform. He was recently appointed Vice Chairman of the Select Interim Committee on Sex Offender Statutes.

Rep. Allen earned a 100 percent favorable voting record during the 2003 Session with Texas Farm Bureau AGFUND.



Rep. Fred Hill (R-Richardson) District 112

Fred Hill of Richardson is running for his ninth term to the Texas House of Representatives. He currently serves as Chairman of the House Local Government Ways and Means Committee, as a member of the Transportation Committee, as well as a member of the Revenue Working Group of the Select Interim Committee on Public School Finance.

In 2003, Rep. Hill had a perfect 100 percent voting record with the Texas Farm Bureau AGFUND. He is an urban member who is a strong supporter of "tort reform," brush control, property rights and preservation of Texas water.



Rep. Linda Harper-Brown (R-Irving) District 105

Linda Harper-Brown was sworn into the Texas House of Representatives on Jan. 14, 2003.

She serves on the Transportation Committee, the Elections Committee, Select Committee on State

Health Care Expenditures Committee and Child Welfare and Adoption Interim Committee. She has been a leader for issues such as limited government, low taxes, and local control of education.

Rep. Harper-Brown scored a perfect 100 percent voting record with Texas Farm Bureau AGFUND during her first session of the Texas Legislature.



Rep. Dan Branch (R-University Park) District 108

Dan Branch was elected to represent House District 108 in 2002. He serves on the Appropriations Committee and as Budget and Oversight Chair of the Public Education Committee. In addition, he was appointed by the Speaker to serve on the House Select Committee on Public School Finance and on the Education Subcommittee of the Appropriations Committee. *Capitol Inside* named him 2003 Freshman of the Year.

Rep. Branch received an 82 percent voting record with the Texas Farm Bureau AGFUND in the 2003 Legislative Session.



Rep. Joe Driver (R-Garland) District 113

Joe Driver has represented House District 113 since 1993. In 2003, Speaker Craddick showed his confidence in the leadership capabilities of Rep. Driver by appointing him to serve as the Chairman of the House Law Enforcement Committee and a member of the Licensing and Administrative Procedure Committee.

Rep. Driver is one of the few House Members who was able to score a perfect 100 percent voting record with Texas Farm Bureau AGFUND, proving he is an ally to agriculture when it comes to issues that will affect agriculture and the rural way of life.
